Baby Barn Pattern for October 2, 2020, Community Sew Day

BAMQ received permission to use this pattern for Sew Day from Fons & Porter's Quick + Easy Quilts, August/September 2020 issue, designer Gina Reddin

Plan

The large patches make this a fast, beginner-friendly quilt.

Use an accurate 1/4" seam allowance throughout to ensure all elements of the quilt fit togeth-

Handle all bias edges carefully to avoid distortion.

Shop

Fabric yardage assumes 40" usable width of fabric (WOF) unless otherwise noted.

- White solid 11/4 yds. for block and binding
- Blue solid 1/2 yd. for block
- Pink solid 1/2 yd. for block
- Yellow solid 1/4 yd. for block
- Backing 11/4 yds.
- Batting 40" x 40"

Cut

Patches are lettered in order of use. Measurements include 1/4" seam allowances.

- · White solid 2 squares 121/8" (A) 1 square 121/2" (E) 4 rectangles 61/2" x 121/2" (D) 5 strips 21/2" x WOF for binding
- · Blue solid 2 squares 127/8" (A)
- · Pink solid 1 square 131/4" (B)
- Yellow solid 4 squares 61/8" (C)

Note: Fabrics in the quilt shown are from Gina's personal collection of assorted fabrics.

Sew

Referring to Quick-Pieced Triangle-Squares in Sew Easy Lessons and to Diagram I, make 4 units using white solid A's and blue solid A's.



2 Referring to Quick-Pieced Flying Geese in Sew Easy Lessons and to Diagram II, make 4 Flying Geese using pink solid B's and yellow solid C's.

- 3 Sew units, Flying Geese, and patches into rows. Join rows together.
- 4 Layer, baste, and quilt. Gina machine quilted straight lines on the diagonal, creating a large X across the quilt surface. Bind the quilt.

SEW EASY Quick-Pieced Flying Geese Units

Try this method to make four perfect Flying Geese units at the same time.



1. On wrong side of each of four small squares, mark diagonal line corner to corner. This will be your cutting line. Mark sewing lines ¼" away from each side of cutting line.



2. Place two small squares on opposite corners of one large square, right sides facing. Corners will overlap slightly at center. Sew along marked sewing lines.



3. Cut along marked cutting lines. Press seams toward small triangles.



4. Place remaining small squares on unit corners. Sew along marked sewing lines.



5. Cut along marked cutting lines.



6. Press seams toward small triangles to complete four Flying Geese units.



Products used: Havel's Self-Healing Cutting Mat, Havel's 6" x 24" Fabric Ruler, and Havel's 45mm Rotary Cutter.
Fabric from Garden Glory collection by Maja Ronnback and Abstract Collage collection by Ampersand, both for Paintbrush Studio Fabric.

TIP: This method works for any size Flying Geese unit. Cut the small squares %" larger than the finished height and the large square 11/4" larger than the finished width.
